1. What Happens With The Data Collected On A Bergen-Passaic SKYWARN Net?

- During Severe Weather SKYWARN Nets:
 - ◆ A designated NWS Liaison Station (*or an operator at the NWS Upton, NY*) will be monitoring the Net and will immediately relay all reports of NWS defined Severe Weather to the appropriate NWS office
 - ◆ *If necessary the Primary Net Control Station will pass Control of the Net to an Alternate Net Control Station, and then contact the NWS*
 - ◆ All reportable Severe Weather and Storm Damage Reports are also sent to the NWS in a Summary Report after the Net is closed

- During Non-severe Weather SKYWARN
Nets or Weather Data Collection Nets
 - ◆ All reports are sent to the NWS in a Summary
Report as soon as the Net is closed.

DOPPLER INDICATES WIDESPREAD LIGHT TO MODERATE RAIN CONTINUES TO FALL WITH AN ADDITIONAL ONE HALF TO ONE INCH OF RAINFALL POSSIBLE THROUGH MIDNIGHT.

■ Spotter Reports Are Used In NWS Storm Data Records

Date: 19 Apr 2002, 05:05:00 PM EST

Here are selected reports of hail from NWS Skywarn Spotters:
Western Passaic County - 1.75-inch diameter hail (golf ball) in Western Passaic, 1.00-inch diameter hail in West Milford, and 0.75-inch diameter hail in Pompton Lake Eastern Passaic County - In Bergen County - from 0.75-inch diameter hail in Saddle Brook to 1.00-inch diameter hail in Dumont

Spotters' wind systems measured a 63 MPH wind gust in Garwood at 6:03 pm EDT and a 60 MPH wind gust in Elizabeth at 6:00 pm EDT. They also reported multiple gustnadoes in Jersey City. Five 2 1/2 story framed houses under construction collapsed and a 20 story high crane snapped in Jersey City.

Here are selected flash flood reports provided by NWS Skywarn spotters: In Bergen County - At 6:05 pm EDT, water ponded up to 1 foot and covered many streets in South Hackensack. At 6:28 pm EDT, a police officer rescued a mother with her child at the intersection of Route 17 and Franklin Ave. in Hasbrouck Heights.
